

Q: What needs to be done before I drop off my child for camp?

A: Before coming to camp, parents should talk to their children about how class will be different and what socially distant means. (i.e. instructor wearing masks, staying in assigned areas, keeping safe distances, remind students to sanitize hands often, repertory etiquette such as coughing, sneezing and blowing nose). Each classroom will have designated areas for students to remain in. Once arriving to camp, parents should be sure that your child has used the restroom before checking them into camp. Please check in with child ready to start class.

Q: Will there be a temperature check at the door?

A: The current procedure requires anyone entering the building to have their temperature checked (must be under 100.4). Parents and students will need to answer a series of questions provided by the health department upon entry as well. Parents and students should stay home if they feel ill.

Q: What is the current drop off/pick up procedure?

A: Parents and students should wait to come inside the building until 10 minutes prior to their camp start time. Only 1 parent should enter the building with the student. Once inside, the parent will wait with their child on the designated spaces marked in the hallways outside of the classrooms. A staff member will greet each participant and verify the parent/guardian phone number. Students will be asked to sanitize their hands, and then be escorted into the classroom for camp. Parents will come back to the same spots in the hallway to pick up their child. Again, only 1 parent should enter the building for drop off and pick up.

Q: Are instructors, students and/or parents required to wear masks and gloves during camp?

A: Students are encouraged to wear fabric coverings by the CDC and Health Department, however they are not required during camp. WCPR staff and Instructors will be wearing masks and gloves during student drop off, pick up and between camps.

Q: Will I be required to stay in the recreation center while my child is in camp?

A: We require that a parent/guardian remain available to be contacted at the phone number provided at drop off. The parent/guardian may either use the facility if they have a pass, wait on one of the porches or leave and come back. In accordance with current guidelines, there will not be a designated waiting area inside the building at this time.

Q: How will you contact the parents if their child needs them?

A: We will collect the name & phone number of the parent/guardian in charge for each child at camp drop off. We will call that number in the event a parent is needed.

Q: Should I send a snack/lunch with my child?

A: For classes 2 hours or more, feel free to send a non-refrigerated PEANUT FREE snack/lunch with your child. All snacks/lunches sent with children will remain on their individual table. Currently the water fountains are closed, however if you send a bottle with your child, they would have the availability to refill it at one of the bottle filling stations.

Q: What measures are being taken to keep the classroom clean and safe?

A: We are sanitizing all desks, chairs, door handles, equipment and supplies used before and after every camp. Hand sanitizer will also be administered to all students entering and exiting the classroom. Staff will be keeping the students at a safe distance from each other during camp with each student having their own spot marked off on the floor. In the event that a table is needed for camp, there will be one student per table and they will use the same table throughout the day/week. Please explain to your student the importance of following the directions and remaining socially distant. All high touch surfaces in the building will be sanitized throughout the day.

Q: How many people will be in class with my child?

A: Theater classes will be limited to 8 students and 2 instructors for each class, and Art classes will be limited to 4 students and 1 instructor per the maximum capacity and social gathering guidelines at this time. All students will be encouraged to stay at least 6 feet away from other students while in class.

Q: What is the refund policy?

A: A withdrawal must be submitted by email to the supervisor of the program. A refund check or credit to the parent's account can be given if the withdrawal request is made 3 or more days before the camp start date. A credit to the parent's account can be given if the withdrawal request is made between 1-3 days before the camp start date. No refunds or credits will be given once camp has begun. Note: Special considerations can be made, but must be submitted in writing before the class is complete.
